June - July 2025 from Pastor Amanda

For the most part, reactions to my upcoming leave of absence (June 2 – July 13) have been positive – most church members are happy that I am pursuing a calling in taking time away to write a book based on my doctoral thesis for other clergy, not because they want me gone (or, at least, I don't think so), but because they see my leave and project as a way of pushing back in our currently uncertain times. My doctoral thesis was entitled "Incorporating Difficult Conversations in Worship," and focused on why potentially divisive/political subjects should be broached in worship and how to do so well. My suggested title for the book version (I say "suggested" as I've been told publishers often go their own way) will be "Preaching Politics." Fellow clergy have been asking for such a book, and the Spirit is telling me "It's time." So here I go.

I want to thank you, because you go with me.

This church is the place where I have been able to openly discuss things from a political perspective, and lead you into those discussions, too. Sure, there has been pushback, but not nearly as much as would occur in many (most) churches. You've gifted me with a place to try out my ideas, and to applaud you in your own efforts. And I love that your openness to politically-charged conversation didn't start with me! Your Church & Society Committee has been bringing political topics in need of discussion to your attention since the Civil Rights era. You are a special church, indeed.

And now, it is because you are such a special church, that I am able to attempt to take the step I'm taking. According to the Book of Discipline (the rulebook of the UMC), pastors are entitled to a leave of absence every six years of full-time ministry. As such, I should have already taken two such leaves, but this is my first. Why? Because many churches are not equipped to continue on without the pastor for an extended length of time. Many clergy never even ask for a leave because they know it's not possible where they are. But it's possible here, because you are a church who adequately cares for one another. You are a church where members volunteer to serve as preachers (and they're GOOD!). You are a church that understands what needs to be done, and what doesn't, so I have full confidence that you will be fine over the next six weeks.

And so I thank you – for being you. For being a church that understands "church." A church is not a building, it's the people. You are a church that wants to make a difference toward the better in this world (caring for other people), and you are church that can stand on its own two feet (caring for yourselves). Not all pastors can say that about where they serve. But I can. And that's what's making my leave possible.

Thank you, again. As I said, you go with me. And I'm grateful.



THE TREVOR PROJECT



The Trevor Project is an American non-profit organization founded in 1998. It focuses on suicide prevention efforts among lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, transgender, queer and questioning youth. Through a toll-free 24-hour telephone number, it operates the Trevor Lifeline, a confidential service that offers trained counselors. Two and a half decades ago, they responded to a health crisis and now they are building a safer, more inclusive world.

LGBTQ young people are four times more likely to attempt suicide, and suicide remains the second leading cause of death among ALL young people in the U.S. In 2024, 39% of LGBTQ+ young people considered attempting suicide in the United States. 50% of LGBTQ+ youth who sought mental health care were not able to receive it. The Trevor Project aims to lower these statistics.

The Trevor Projects' five key programs are: Crisis Services, Peer Support, Research, Public Education, and Advocacy.





Update on our Sanctuary

The shoring has been installed! We're currently awaiting clearance from the town, which we anticipate happening soon, and then we will no longer be in violation for having an unsafe structure on our property. While there was some anticipation that we may have been able to worship inside the sanctuary once the shoring was completed, that will not be possible as the necessary scaffolding is too extensive in the space, so worship will remain in Fellowship Hall. We are thankful to our Building Committee for their work thus far.



Church Financial Update – April 2025

Dear Church Family,

Thank you for your faithful giving and generous hearts. Because of your support, we carry out ministries that make our church a place of hope, compassion, and community outreach. We could not do it without you.

This is to inform you that we are in relatively good financial standing. With contributions through plate offering, thrift shop collections, and building use donations, we had a bank balance of \$241,255.91 on April 30, 2025. Within this amount, there is a separate fund called the "Sanctuary of Hope", which reserves expenses specifically related to the sanctuary roof. At the time of this writing, the Sanctuary of Hope Fund holds \$102,870.22. We do expect expenses for roof to increase.

As we continue "Serving God Through Serving the Community", our hope for the future continues to rise. The outcome of the sanctuary roof relies on this hope. Please continue supporting the hope through contributions to the "Sanctuary of Hope" fund. Kindly keep in mind the "Sanctuary of Hope" fund is different from the Building Fund, which is reserved for Capital Improvement projects independent of the sanctuary roof. This is an important distinction to make on the offering envelopes.

Thank you for your ongoing support in ministry and partnership with the "Sanctuary of Hope" fund.
